

# Sea Cucumber

### Sea Cucumber

Recently, the **Indian Coast Guard (ICG)** has seized two tonnes of sea cucumber, a banned marine species, in the **Gulf of Mannar** and Palk Bay areas in Tamil Nadu.

## **Key Points**

- About:
  - Sea cucumbers are marine invertebrates that live on the seafloor found generally in tropical regions. They're named for their unusual oblong shape that resembles a fat cucumber.
- o There are about 1,250 species of sea cucumber, all of which belong to the

#### taxonomic class Holothuroidea.

- This class falls under the **Echinodermata phylum**, which also includes many other well-known marine invertebrates, such as sea stars, sea urchins and sand dollars.
- They are **crucial to maintain the balance of ocean habitats.**

# Significance:

- o They are an integral part of the **coral ecosystem as one of the main by- products** of the sea cucumbers digestion of sand is calcium carbonate and this is essential for the survival of the coral reefs.
- o They act like garbage collectors of the ocean world, and they recycle nutrients, thus playing an important role in keeping coral reefs in good condition.

#### **Threats:**

 Illegal Trading and smuggling since the species is high in demand across south-east Asia, mainly China, for food and traditional medicine.

#### **Protection:**

- o **IUCN Red List:** Brown Sea Cucumber (Endangered), Blackspotted Sea Cucumber (Least Concern), Blue Sea Cucumber (Data Deficient), etc.
- o Wildlife Protection Act, 1972: Schedule I.

#### **Conservation Efforts:**









o In 2020, the **Lakshadweep Islands administration** created the world's first conservation area - 239 sq. km - for sea cucumbers.
